ICON PAINTING WORKSHOP – JULY 14-19

Iconographer Symeon van Donkelaar will teach 12 participants over a week to make an Orthodox icon using traditional methods and materials. The workshop provides the experience of making an icon by carefully copying one of Christ the Pantocrator created by Symeon for this purpose. Such work from a prototype makes room for new students to train their eyes to look carefully and gain the skills their hands need to learn. The class includes all the materials and tools needed for completing the icon.
